And that's what we're going to work through because of course for organic farmers tillage is very important tool, but I think that even conventional farmers are going to find that they're going to need tillage to reintroduce as a tool, as weeds become resistant to herbicides, and as the public changes and through government, as things get deregistered and people take a different look on what they think of as herbicides, or what chemicals can be used. So that's what we're gonna be talking about there and that's what I'm working on.

Next, I just want to highlight a couple other events where we'll be in person or anybody in southern Alberta. There's a Farming Smarter conference and trade show. It's happening on the 15th and the 16th. And there's a great lineup of speakers both on the nitty gritty of agronomy and looking at larger trends. So, I'll have a booth there and I look forward to seeing anyone who is in my area to come and see me there.

At the end of the month, I will have a booth at Ag Expo which is in Lethbridge. From February 28 to march 2.
